

CITY OF RUS SELLVILLE, KENTUCKY
EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-02

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 President Donald J. Trump declared a national state of emergency in response to the coronavirus, COVID-19, pandemic;

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2020 Governor Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency in Kentucky in response to the first documented case of the novel coronavirus, COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death and can easily spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Stratton has determined that the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, presents a severe and complex threat to the public health, safety, and welfare of citizens that extraordinary emergency measures are warranted pursuant to KRS 39A.100 (2) and KRS 39B.070; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Stratton, Mayor of the City of Russellville, by virtue of the authority vested in me by KRS Chapter 39A and 39B of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, do hereby Order that all buildings owned and operated by the City of Russellville to be closed to the public in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Russellville from the spread of COVID-19.

This order shall remain in effect until terminated by the issuance of another Executive Order when I determine these extraordinary measures are no longer required for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare.
