ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, KENTUCKY, STATING ITS INTENTION TO ANNEX CERTAIN TERRITORY INTO THE CITY LIMITS, INCLUDING THE BOUNDARY LINES OF THE PROPOSED ANNEXED TERRITORY, WITH A SEVERABILITY AND REPEALER CLAUSE, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WITNESSETH: THAT WHEREAS, the City of Russellville has made a determination that the annexation of certain territory into the city limits is desirable and in the best interest of the city;

AND WHEREAS, a boundary line survey of the proposed annexed territories has been prepared:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, that:

1) The City of Russellville, Kentucky does hereby state its intention to annex the territory as more specifically defined in the boundary line description attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A". Said territory encompassing a total of 867.8 acres.
2) All portions of any section of any ordinance or rule or regulation in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict only.
3) In the event any provision of this Ordinance is invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of any other provision.
4) This ordinance shall be effective after it passage and publication according to law.
