## ORDINANCE NO. 97- 9

## AN ORDINANCE CLOSING A PORTION OF VANCE LANE; WITH SEVERABILITY AND REPEALER CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

THAT WHEREAS, the City of Russellville has determined that a portion of Vance Lane should be closed, and the abutting landowners have consented to this closing;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE THAT:

Section 1: A strip of land located at the castern end of the paved portion of Vance Lane in the City of Russellville, said strip of land being 40 feet wide by 90 feet long (as shown on the attached plat), is hereby closed as a public road. This shall not affect the remainder of said street which shall remain as a public road.

Section 2: The property owners that abut the portion of this street being closed are Warren Glenn Orange and wife, Brenda Sue Orange, Chris Kramer and wife, Caryl Kramer and R. J. Corman Railroad, Memphis Line. All of these property owners have received written notice of this proposed closing and they have all given their notarized consent to the closing. Upon the closing of this portion of the roadway, the western one-half (1/2) of the property shall revert to Warren Glenn Orange and wife, Brenda Sue Orange, and the eastern one-half (1/2) shall revert to Chris Kramer and wife, Caryl Kramer, with R. J. Corman Railroad, Memphis Line, not receiving any ownership in accordance with the parties' consent and agreement.

Section 3: In the event any provision of this Ordinance is invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of any other provisions.

Section 4: All portions of any section of any ordinance or rule or regulation in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict only.

Section 5: This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication according to
