

ORDINANCE NO. 98- 12

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO.94-7 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE CONCERNING USE OF THE MUNICIPAL SANITARY SEWAGE COLLECTION AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT WORKS, SETTING FORTH THE POLICY, DEFINITIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING THE USE OF SAID SYSTEM, CONTROLLING PRIVATE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL, GOVERNING THE BUILDING OF SEWERS AND CONNECTIONS, POLLUTANT DISCHARGE LIMITS, PRETREATMENT PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION, ESTABLISHING THE RIGHT OF THE CITY TO CHARGE FEES FOR ADMINISTERING THE CITY'S REASONABLY NECESSARY FUNCTIONS RELATED TO SEWER USE, AND DELINEATING POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF INSPECTORS AND SETTING FORTH THE METHODS AND PROCEDURES OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDINANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAME AND REPEALING PRIOR ORDINANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAME AND REPEALING PRIOR ORDINANCES"; WITH REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Russellville, Kentucky, has previously enacted ORDINANCE NO. 94-7 "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE CONCERNING USE OF THE MUNICIPAL SANITARY SEWAGE COLLECTION AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT WORKS, SETTING FORTH THE POLICY, DEFINITIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING THE USE OF SAID SYSTEM, CONTROLLING PRIVATE WASTEWATER DISPOSAL, GOVERNING THE BUILDING OF SEWERS AND CONNECTIONS, POLLUTANT DISCHARGE LIMITS, PRETREATMENT PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION, ESTABLISHING THE RIGHT OF THE CITY TO CHARGE FEES FOR ADMINISTERING THE CITY'S REASONABLY NECESSARY FUNCTIONS RELATED TO SEWER USE, AND DELINEATING POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF INSPECTORS AND SETTING FORTH THE METHODS AND PROCEDURES OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDINANCE AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAME AND REPEALING PRIOR ORDINANCES; WITH REPEALER

AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE and said ordinance included the maximum daily limits for pollutants discharged into the POTW;

AND WHEREAS, the City has determined that the maximum daily limits should be amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, THAT:

1. Article V, Section 2(10) shall be amended to read as follows:

Copper, total	0.675 <u>0.38</u>

Cyanide, total	0.12 <u>None</u>
Lead, total	0.150 <u>0.24</u>
Mercury, total	0.0005
Nickel, total	0.24 <u>3.98</u>
PCBs, total	0.0002 <u>0.0001</u>
Phenols, total	0.900 <u>1.72</u>
Silver, total	0.410 <u>0.55</u>
Toxic Organics, total	2.130
Zinc, total	0.825 <u>2.61</u>

2. In the event any provision of this Ordinance is invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of any other provision.

3. All portions of any section of any ordinance or rule or regulation in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict only.

4. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication according to law.
