## CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE NO. 2012-13

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2004-11 TO LIMIT THE ELIGIBILITY FOR A TEMPORARY SALE OR DISPLAY PERMIT FOR OFF-SITE SALES OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2004, the Russelfville City Council passed Ordinance 2004-11, which enabled motor vehicle dealers to obtain permits from the City to conduct temporary off-site motor vehicle sales; and

WHEREAS, the Russellville City Council deems it necessary to protect the interests of the local citizens and the local businesses from the adverse impact of such off-site sales; and

WHEREAS, the Russellville City Council has determined that in order to provide the necessary protection to the local citizens and local businesses it is necessary to limit the eligibility for the required permits to those motor vehicle dealers that are operating permanent motor vehicle dealerships within Logan County, Kentucky, at the time of applying for the permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL IN AND FOR THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

## SECTION A: SUBSTANTIVE AMENDMENTS

Ordinance 2004-11, Section II. "PERMIT REQUIRED" shall be amended as follows:

No person, corporation or other business entity other than a licensed motor vehicle dealer or a new vehicle manufacturer, as defined in KRS 190.010, shall conduct, hold, or otherwise participate in a temporary sale or display of motor vehicles at a location other than in the established place of business as specified in the licensed motor vehicles dealer's State license

without first obtaining a temporary sale or display permit from the Clerk of the City of Russellville. No person, corporation or other business entity other than a Kentucky licensed motor vehicle dealer operating a motor vehicle dealership which is permanently located within Logan County. Kentucky shall be entitled to receive a temporary sale or display permit under this section except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

SECTION B: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

In the event any provision of this Ordinance is invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision.

SECTION C: REPEALER CLAUSE

All portions of any ordinance or rule or regulation in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict only.

SECTION D: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication according to law.
